Young Citizen Awards

Dunbar Community Council initiated the Young Citizen Awards in 2014 to celebrate the very significant contribution that young people make to the life of Dunbar.

This year, we have worked directly with Dunbar Grammar School to seek out individuals who have impressed both their peers and school staff by their outstanding achievements their sphere of influence... and often, the spheres are several!

This year we are delighted to make awards to three young people and the first of these awards is made to:

Lewis Campbell

Lewis Campbell is firstly a formidable sportsman excelling in badminton. He has been a medal winner in competition for several years and this year reached the semi-finals in both singles and doubles in the Scottish Championships, winning a silver medal in the doubles competition.

Lewis shares his enthusiasm for his sport with others by running the Dunbar Grammar School Badminton Club.

To quote one member of DGS staff, "Lewis is a brilliant lad giving up a heck of a lot of his own time. He has a great relationships with the kids, he is always encouraging, and he has really increased numbers participating."

Lewis contributes to other school communities too, helping with 'Health and Wellbeing Classes' and working with Primary School pupils. As a measure of his involvement, he was invited to accompany the Primary 5s to York earlier this session.

Lewis is an outstanding student and won the Bronze Award in the Scottish Mathematical Council's Awards 2016/17 for Lothian and Borders.

Outside of school, Lewis is a dedicated Sea Cadet and has been recommended for advancement to Probationary Petty Officer. He will teach younger cadets in this capacity and continue to play a part even after he commences his university career in the autumn.

Zosia Kuczok

Zosia Kuczok is also a multi talented high achiever.

In 2015, she was one of the Dunbar Grammar School team that won the Scottish regional competition for the Coca-Cola Enterprises (CCE) Real Business Challenge and she and the team then travelled to London for the National Grand Finals where they showcased their business campaign.

Zosia has been selected to participate in the 'Exceptional Programme' run by the Impressive People, a North Berwick based charity, that seeks out and supports pupils who have been identified as having, in their words, a 'rare talent'.

In 2016 Zosia joined in the launch of the Law Society Scotland's new Lawscot Foundation that will offer financial assistance and mentoring support to students from less advantaged backgrounds to help them as they study at University for a law degree or the Diploma in Professional Legal Practice.

Zosia is one of the leaders of the DGS Amnesty Group and last year was successful with her application onto the 2016-17 Amnesty Youth Advisory Group. She will represent UK young people at meetings in London which will take place 6 times over

the next year. The standard and quantity of applications was very high, so huge congratulations to Zosia!

At Dunbar Grammar School, Zosia is involved with Peacejam and has fundraised for and helped to run the Breakfast Club. She is part of the team that initiated, designed and produced Peacejam's Dementia Friendly Colouring booklet (which will be available shortly!) and organised the DGS Mental Health Awareness Week.

Brad is a Tae Kwan Do champion. He first competed in the world championships at junior level in Canada in 2012 and, in 2014 in Italy, he became world junior heavyweight champion.

In 2016, he competed at hyperweight (82 kg+) in the World Championship at Brighton, winning gold and silver medals for sparring and a second gold as a member of the UK team in the team competition.

He has shared his passion for his sport by coaching up and coming youngsters and some of his students are already competing successfully at national events.

As part of the family business, Robertson's Martial Arts-PTK, Brad is involved in ELC's Active Schools programme. In this school session he has been working with DPS P4 pupils and is about to deliver after school classes for DPS p1-3 and has proved an inspiring and able teacher.

Samantha has been a committed member of Dunbar Sea Cadets. She has worked her way fully up the ranks and is currently a Petty Officer Cadet, helping now to train young Sea Cadets in Dunbar.

The Sea Cadets have offered Samantha the chance to become actively involved with young people throughout the UK and her energy and enthusiasm for the Sea Cadets have led to a number of high profile nominations and awards.

In June 2016, Samantha was selected as one of the candle bearing team for the overnight vigil for the Battle of the Somme held at Scotland's War Memorial. She joined Major General Mark Strudwick, chairman of the Battle of the Somme Vigil, Major William Wright, representing the Royal Regiment of Scotland, and Alan Hamilton, a descendant of one of the Somme fallen at a memorial service preceding the vigil.

Samantha is a keen offshore sailor and was the unanimous crew choice for Offshore Cadet of the Year for 2016/17 following a number of periods offshore in the Sea Cadets rigged training ship, TS Royalist.

The highlight of Samantha's Cadet career however came this year when Samantha bacame the first cadet from SE Scotland to be chosen as the Sea Cadets' Northern Area Navy Board Cadet.

Each year, one 16 -17 year old sea cadet is selected from over 14,000 cadets to represent each of the six Cadet operational areas. As a Navy Board Cadet, Samantha will act as an advisor to the Navy Board on all matters concerning Sea Cadets and Naval youth. She will also have a role as ambassador for the Sea Cadets and represent them at various ceremonies and events throughout the year.

Back in the 1970s, Allan Kerr had wanted to follow in his grandfather Charlie's footsteps by joining the East Linton fire service. However he lived at Phantassie and in those days you could not join the East Linton brigade if you lived outside the 30 mph limit.

In 1973, he moved to Dunbar and in 1987 joined the Dunbar brigade when he was in his 30s. Now 30 years later, he has retired. In an interview with The Courier, Allan said, "I would just like to say it has been a pleasure serving the community of Dunbar over all the years and helping the people of Dunbar with their fire calls. To me, it was never about money, it was about being able to serve the community." And that is what he did - for more than three decades.

Allan is currently chairman of Dunbar Bowling Club and is actively building exciting opportunities for young people to learn this sport. You will hopefully see him in action during Civic Week.
